

CERTIFICATE IN TEACHING CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

Origin of the Course - Genesis School for Special Needs based on a training program, "Para Educators: Lifelines in the Classroom" published by Program Development Associates.

The course is prepared for teachers and para-professionals (teacher assistants, shadow teachers, domestic helpers) to provide training in strategies and methods of working with children with special needs including specific learning disabilities, ADHD, dyslexia, autism spectrum disorders and slow learners both in self-contained special needs schools and mainstream schools. The examinations are school based and assess theory and practice.

Expected Outcomes:

- Mainstream teachers from K1-Sec 4 will be prepared to teach children with special learning needs and manage inappropriate behavior more effectively without taking time away from the other students.
- 2. Para-professionals will be prepared to assist the head teacher with groups of children who require additional support.
- 3. Learning Support Co-ordinators will be prepared to implement strategies learned thereby increasing effective outcomes.
- 4. Untrained teachers working in special schools will be prepared to implement strategies and behavior management techniques more effectively.
